



K-9 Final Report Cards

K-9 Final Report Cards. Final mark/Term mark should be a Proficiency mark or W (not enough evidence to assess):

• Enter a comment (follow the Comment Framework)



Enter a Term Grade and Final Grade (identical)

10-12: Final Mark should be % or W (not enough evidence to assess) This is standard for Withdrawal as students cannot be Incomplete at year end.

No blank Term marks (K-9) or Final marks (K-12)

TRAX uploads

Once final marks have been entered in Aspen, high schools and K-12 schools should do a final TRAX upload and then review the TRAX error reports and graduating reports. If you need help with TRAX uploads or unresolved TRAX errors, please contact Anne Copland (anne.copland@yukon.ca) as soon as possible.

School's use of Social Media

TSI (Technology and Student Information) is in the midst of a Privacy Compliance audit issued by the OIPC (Office of the Information & Privacy Commissioner) with respect to Yukon schools' use of social media (Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, as examples).



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We have recently received the OIPC's final report, and are preparing a response. We ask that schools refrain from posting student images, or their work, on social media sites, or school web sites, until clear direction is provided. **This includes students that have signed media release forms on file at the school.** This does not concern school newsletters.

The use of social media sites requires your school's superintendent or executive director's approval. No new sites should be initiated at this time.

To protect both staff and students, school staff should not have images of students on their personal devices. Capturing student learning, or celebratory occasions at school should be limited to institutionally-owned devices that are wiped at the end of each school year.
