

## Reporting and Assessment Guidelines: K-12

**Student assessment survey:** We are finalizing the student assessment survey with the plan to roll it out February 4 to March 4 at schools who started Option 1 in 2017-18. Please the attached questions we will be asking parents. **These are confidential until the survey is finalized and should not be shared.** There is also a FAQ attached for more information.

Educator feedback: We determined that limiting educator feedback to a survey would not be effective. Instead, if any educators have feedback on the implementation of the new student assessment and reporting guidelines, please provide your feedback to an Assessment Committee representative at your school. ## **Numeracy and Literacy Assessments**

Graduation Literacy and Numeracy Assessments: A reminder that B.C. recently announced there will now be two Literacy Assessments for students in Grades 10-12. Next year, students in Grade 10 will write a Grade 10 Literacy Assessment. In January 2021, students in Grade 12 will start writing a Grade 12 Literacy Assessment. The Numeracy Assessment is already being used this school year and B.C. is now referring to it as the Grade 10 Numeracy Assessment. #### Home computers for students

Refurbished computers are available for student home use from Computers for Schools Yukon, a federally funded nonprofit organization with in-kind contributions from Government of Yukon. Depending on the device, there may be nominal fees. To access these computers, teachers or administrators must request the computers on their students' behalf. Schools **should not** use this program to add devices to their school or classroom. Schools should always contact the Department of Education first to discuss emerging technology needs. In addition, IT support cannot be provided for devices students might bring to school. <u>Learn what is available, fees, and how to request a computer.</u>
