Off-Site Experiential Learning Trips

Off-Site Experiential Learning Trips

There is a newly designated email address to send Complex and Out-of-Territory off-site experiential learning plans to: offsite@yukon.ca. Please ensure that trip plans are complete by following the checklist provided, including COVID protocols, and be sure to send them in at least two weeks prior for Complex trips and, once permitted to resume again, four weeks for Out-of-Territory trips. Your trip will then be reviewed by the Off-Site Review Committee focusing on risk management and by your area Superintendent.

Off-Site Learning Trips – Incident Reporting

The Off-Site Review Committee reviewed many amazing trip plans this spring. Undoubtedly,, incidents happen due to the nature of some of the activities despite our best efforts to mitigate hazards. An incident could be an injury, illness, a near miss, equipment damage or failure, a close wildlife encounter, lost student, or use of a contingency plan. If an incident occurred, complete an Incident form and submit it to your Principal after the trip. This is an important and required step that describes the incident from your perspective as the trip leader. Pack a few blank forms with you on the trip. These Incident Forms are different than incident forms you may use if a student hurts themselves on the school grounds, such as playground injuries during recess.
