# **Significant Indigeneous Dates and Events**

National Day of Awareness for Missing and Murdered Indigeneous Womean and Girls Indigenous Employees Forum (IEF) invites all employees to participate in raising awareness

MMIWG stands for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls—a movement to raise awareness about the epidemic of Indigenous women going missing or being killed.

#### Join us:

10 a.m. Hang a red dress in the Yukon government main administration building courtyard.

11 a.m. Meet at the MMIWG statue in Rotary Park and join the walk to the Kwanlin Dün Cultural Centre.



The empty red dresses are meant to	
signify the loss of thousands of	
Indigenous women, girls and two-	
spirit, lesbian, gay, trans, bisexual,	
queer, questioning, intersex and	
asexual (2SLGTBQQIA) people.	

Indigenous women and girls are 5 times more likely to experience violence than any other population in Canada. This violence tends to result in harm that is more serious.

- wear a red dress pin;
- hang a red dress in your work area window;
- bring a red dress to hang in the courtyard in front of the Main Administration building at 10 a.m.;
- meet at the MMIWG statue at 11 a.m. in Rotary Park and join the walk to the Kwanlin Dün Cultural Centre:

- hang a poster in your work area; and
