Mandatory Vaccine Requirements

Details for Employees

Yukon government employees will be required, as of November 30, 2021, to have at least their first dose of the COVID-19 vaccine. They must have their second dose by January 30, 2022.

Employees of the Department of Education need to take additional steps to enter their vaccination data using My HR File system.

Follow these steps to access the My HR File system at home or at work:

- 1. Go to the Remote Access Portal
- 2. Enter your YESNET AD/Rapid Identity username (firstname.lastname@yesnet.yk,ca)
- 3. Choose "My HR File"
- 4. Enter your rapid identity credentials again to access the HRMS portal

If employees are having trouble accessing the My HR File system, please refer them to the Knowledge Base article provided by ITSS for more detailed instructions.

Teachers on Call can submit proof of vaccination over the telephone by contacting HR at (867) 393-7132. If employees are interested in finding more information about vaccination, they can find more information here.

Call for Papers

We are writing to you on behalf of a group of Canadian parliamentarians that collaborates with its international counterparts to address matters of importance to the Arctic. Canadian parliamentarians cooperate with other Arctic parliamentarians through the Standing Committee of Parliamentarians of the Arctic Region (the Committee). Parliamentarians from the eight Arctic states are represented on this Committee, with representatives from Canada, the Kingdom of Denmark (including Greenland and the Faroe Islands), the European Parliament, Finland, Iceland, Norway, the Russian Federation, Sweden, and the United States of America. Arctic Indigenous organizations also serve as permanent participants on the Committee. The Committee meets several times a year to discuss matters of importance to the Arctic and to Arctic Peoples.

This year, the Committee has launched a new initiative, inviting students of the northern and Arctic regions of respective circumpolar countries to prepare written, audio or video submissions to the Committee highlighting the importance of mental health to Arctic youth. The submissions received will be shared with Committee members and will help inform and support the work of Arctic parliamentarians in the future.

The call for papers is designed for students 14 to 16 years of age and asks them to address the following question:

What does mental health mean to you, and what would strengthen your mental health?

The deadline for submissions is 3 December 2021. For more information on this initiative and the Committee's work, please visit our Facebook page or our website (www.arcticparl.org). We look forward to reading and watching the submissions, to learning more about what mental health means to Arctic youth in Canada and abroad, and to finding new ways to strengthen mental health for the youth of today and the youth of future generations.

The Council of Ministers of Education, Canada (CMEC), under the leadership of the Registrars for Teacher Certification Canada (RTCC), is recruiting English-speaking, French-speaking, and bilingual teachers and
