COVID-19 Vaccine Requirements

COVID-19 Vaccine Requirements

All Yukon government employees will now <u>be required to have their first dose of the COVID-19 vaccine</u> by **November 30, 2021** and their **second dose no later than January 30, 2021**. This will ensure employees who have not yet been immunized have enough time to receive both doses of the vaccine before the new requirement comes into place.

Throughout the pandemic, the Yukon government has followed the guidance and recommendations of Yukon's Chief Medical Officer of Health. As Yukon's largest employer, we have a duty to lead by example and do our part to keep each other and our communities safe from COVID-19. Requiring mandatory vaccinations for our employees is one more way we can ensure our workplaces are as safe as possible.

Details for our approach to mandatory COVID-19 vaccines for employees are still being determined – more information will be made available in the coming days, including a Q&A document for employees.

From 1979 to 2002, Wendy was a member of the Canadian Forces, where she served as a Supply Technician. In 2020, she was elected Chief of the Algonquins of Pikwakanagan First Nation.
