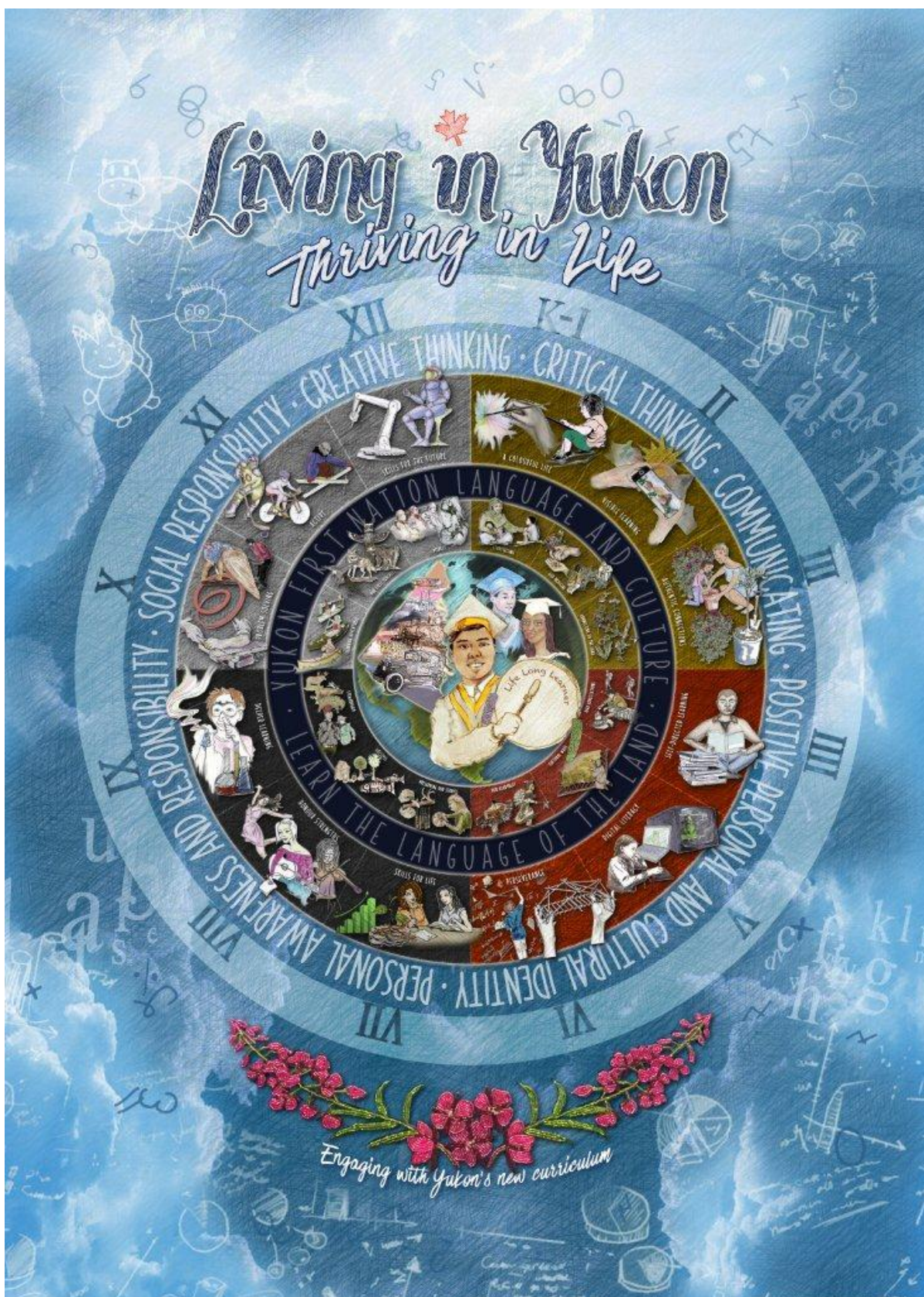

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Reporting and Assessment Guidelines: K-12

- **FreshGrade Update:**

- **Communicating Student Learning in K4 Programs in rural Yukon**
The K4 program is part of the Early Learning Programs (ELPs) which follow the preschool curriculum designed by the Child Development Center, the BC Early Learning Framework, BC redesigned Kindergarten curriculum or a combination of the above depending on the needs of the students.

To date, informal communication on student learning has been required for students in K4. Regardless of the type of Early Learning Programming being run within a school, some form of “communicating student learning” must be provided to parents.

Students that have not opted out, will have accounts provisioned in both systems. Elementary schools may also make use of the tools, by request and by providing the opt out forms to parents.
