Assessment and Reporting

Graduation Program Assessments: Will the lack of a time change in Yukon affect the assessments?

No, Yukon students will still be able to write the assessment(s) between 9 AM and 3 PM Yukon time Nov. 2-6. As another reminder, for this year only, Grade 12 students are not required to write the Grade 10 Literacy Assessment, including Évaluation de littératie de la 10e année – Français langue première.

- Students who entered grade 10 this year will:
 - Write the Gr. 10 Numeracy Assessment and the Grade 10 Literacy Assessment this year
 - No provincial assessment in their grade 11 year
 - Write the Grade 12 Literacy Assessment in their Grade 12 year.
- Students who entered grade 11 this year will:
 - Write the Grade 10 Numeracy Assessment and Grade 10 Literacy Assessment (if not already written)
 - Write the Grade 12 Literacy Assessment in their Grade 12 year.
- Students who entered grade 12 this year will:
 - Write the Grade 10 Numeracy Assessment this year (if not already written (if not already written))

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- Complete a course-based English Language Arts 12 assessment this year.
- Note: Français langue première 10, Français langue première 12 and Français langue seconde immersion 12 provincial exam changes will be the same as their equivalents above.

Professional Learning Opportunities

November 20 PD Day

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Nonviolent Crisis Intervention (NCI) Training
