What does participation in a Learning Network involve? Think of it as a type of action research. All participants will take a deep dive into an aspect of their teaching practice utilizing the Spiral of Inquiry as a guide. This is a highly collaborative and facilitated process. Participants will attend three full-day collaboration sessions between now and Aprilculminating with a Celebration of Learning in April, 2023. At the Celebration of Learning participants are given the opportunity to present a brief overview of their work to all network participants. Resources for Educators

Attention all grade 3-5 classroom educators!

Fire Prevention Week is approaching fast and we need your help to spread the word on Fire Safety! The theme this year is **"Fire Won't Wait Plan Your Escape."**

Today's homes burn faster than ever. You may have as little as two minutes to safely escape a home fire, that's as much time from when the smoke alarm sounds. Your ability to get out of a home during a fire depends on early warning from smoke alarms and advance planning.

From October 9-15, Firefighters would like to visit your class to discuss fire safety. There are a few options that we can provide, depending on what you would like us to cover. We are happy to work with you to present something that is most valuable to you and your class. Below are a few options which you can choose from::

- 1. 20-25 minute classroom presentation. We'llfocus on this year's theme and discuss home escape plans with your students. The presentation will include a short video, handouts and a group exercise planning a fire escape.
- 2. 35-45 minute classroom presentation. We'llcover everything in the shorter presentation as well as: home fire hazards, how to report an emergency to 911, camp fire safety, and stop drop and roll.
- 3. 25-30 minute tour and demonstration of a fire truck. After we finish presenting in the classroom we encourage students to come outside to learn about one of our fire trucks. The students will get to learn about the equipment on the truck, how firefighter protective equipment works and how the truck receives and delivers water to hose lines.
