National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

On September 30, the Government of Yukon will observe the first National Day for Truth and Reconciliation—a day to pause, reflect, and acknowledge the tragic history and ongoing legacy of residential schools.

The National Day for Truth and Reconciliation was first proposed in 2015 by the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada, which called upon the federal government, in collaboration with Indigenous peoples, to establish a statutory holiday to honour Survivors of residential schools, their families, and communities, and ensure that public commemoration of the history and legacy of residential schools remains a vital component of the reconciliation process.

This date coincides with Orange Shirt Day, which began in 2013, and involved wearing orange shirts to honour Indigenous children forced to leave their families to attend residential schools.

Schools across the territory will be closed on this day, and students, staff, and educators are encouraged to use this time to reflect on the role they play in truth and reconciliation; learn more about First Nations communities; and recommit to understanding Canada's history with Indigenous peoples.

Yukon Foundation Skills Assessments (YFSAs)

The 2021-22 YFSA administration in schools will take place between Oct. 4 and Nov. 12, 2021. Schools should receive their YFSA supplies parcel by the end of September. The YFSA Assessment Description and Specifications are available on the <u>BC Ministry of Education Website</u>. The <u>sample YFSA's</u> provide teachers and students with a preview of the sample online questions, sample student booklet and sample collaboration activity.

Learning Networks 2021-2022 Expression of Interest

Harnessing the Spiral of Inquiry, Learning Networks strive to help teachers improve learning conditions for their students. With an open and curious mind Yukon teachers have been doing just this for the past several years. Yukon Education is once again offering Learning Networks as an option for the 2021-22 school year.

What does participation in a Learning Network involve? Think of it as a type of action research. All participants will take a deep dive into an aspect of their teaching practice utilizing the <u>Spiral of Inquiry</u> as a guide. This is a

highly collaborative and facilitated process. Participants will attend three full-day collaboration sessions between now and April, culminating with a Celebration of Learning in April, 2022. At the Celebration of Learning participants are given the opportunity to present a brief overview of their work to all network participants.
