# **National Day for Truth and Reconciliation**

Each year, September 30 marks the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation.

The day honours the children who never returned home and Survivors of residential schools, as well as their families and communities. Public commemoration of the tragic and painful history and ongoing impacts of residential schools is a vital component of the reconciliation process.

Both the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and Orange Shirt Day take place on September 30.

Orange Shirt Day is an Indigenous-led grassroots commemorative day intended to raise awareness of the individual, family and community inter-generational impacts of residential schools, and to promote the concept of "Every Child Matters". The orange shirt is a symbol of the stripping away of culture, freedom and self-esteem experienced by Indigenous children over generations.

On September 30, we encourage all Canadians to wear orange to honour the thousands of Survivors of residential schools. Please see attached poster for emotional supports and a reconciliation gathering for all Yukon government employees.

# **Technology Guidelines and Forms**

These are the ones that should go home at the beginning of the year:

- Opt Out Form for Student Use of Microsoft Office 365 and other Cloud Services This only has to be done once.

# Cloud-based Services- Use of Microsoft 365, Google Workspace, Adobe Creative Cloud, and Sora-

For students to have Microsoft 365, Google Workspace, Adobe Creative Cloud, and Sora accounts provisioned to them, their parents/guardians must be provided with the Cloud Services Letter of Intent, the opt out form, and be provided time to make their decision. This process only needs to be done once for the student's K-12 career. This letter and form are available <a href="mailto:here">here</a> or from David McInnes (<a href="mailto:david.mcinnes@yukon.ca">david.mcinnes@yukon.ca</a>) and the return date can be customized by each school.

After the consideration period has passed, and Principals are aware of the classrooms intent to use these services, schools can submit a ticket to <a href="itss@yesnet.yk.ca">itss@yesnet.yk.ca</a> with the list of students, and those that may have opted out. We will assign permission for cloud services in Aspen. A process will provision M365, Google, Adobe, and Sora accounts to all the students (except those that have opted out) in Rapid ID. At that point, students will see the M365, Google Workspace, Adobe, and Sora tiles in their Rapid ID portal when they log-in.

All teachers have access to these platforms in their Rapid Id portal (https://portal.yesnet.yk.ca/) by default.

# Sora Library app is now available!

The digital reading platform SORA has been added to the suite of apps that we can access through our YESNET accounts and credentials. A tile has been added to the Rapid Identity dashboard for easy access.

For teachers and administrators:

Sora can be accessed through a tile in Rapid ID using your Rapid ID login credentials.

#### For students:

Sora can be accessed through a tile in Rapid ID using your Rapid ID login credentials. Cloud Consent needs to be granted before students can access it. To find out how cloud consent is managed go here.



#### Features of the platform include:

- A built-in ebook reader
- An audiobook player
- Easy access to assigned titles
- A running tally of time spent reading and numbers of books read

#### With Sora you can:

- Borrow a book and start reading with a single tap.
- Add bookmarks, create, and export notes and highlights.
- Define words and review a list of all the words that you have looked up.
- Earn achievements for reading, and for completing certain tasks in Sora.
- Synch your progress. Your place, bookmarks, notes, and highlights sync between devices.
- Customize settings. Adjust the font type, font size, and lighting in most books.
- Explore books by Lexile, Grade, or Interest Level and find 'Read-Along' books.
- Select titles have professional narration so you can follow along with the text.
- Read comic books, graphic novels, picture books, and textbooks as they are meant to be read

# Learning Networks 2022-2023 Expression of Interest

Harnessing the Spiral of Inquiry, Learning Networks strive to help teachers improve learning conditions for their students. With an open and curious mind Yukon teachers have been doing just this for the past several years. Yukon Education is once again offering Learning Networks as an option for the 2022-23 school year.

What does participation in a Learning Network involve? Think of it as a type of action research. All participants will take a deep dive into an aspect of their teaching practice utilizing the Spiral of Inquiry as a guide. This is a highly collaborative and facilitated process. Participants will attend three full-day collaboration sessions between now and April, culminating with a Celebration of Learning in April, 2023. At the Celebration of Learning participants are given the opportunity to present a brief overview of their work to all network participants.

### Agencies in the Schools

Newly approved agencies in the school include the Gwaandak Theatre project, Workplace Sexual Harassment and Salmon in the Schools.

The Gwaandak Theatre project is a local play that support curricular learning standards in social studies, Law, and career life education for grades 10-12 students. The play provides an opportunitity to learn about discrimination and harassment and promotes the principle that every individual is free and equal of dignity and rights.

The Workplace Sexual Harrassment project supports grade 8-12 career education curriculum learning standards. In this presentation, students will learn how to identify workplace harassment, its impacts on individuals and workplaces, and rights as an employee.

<u>Salmon in the schools</u> project has been approved again for use in Yukon Schools. This project supports students in learning more about salmon, why salmon are at risk, and why we should protect salmon.
