

New curriculum: K-10

New Grade 10 curriculum: As you know, we are starting to use the new curriculum for Grade 10 this year. The Grade 10 curriculum is available online in both [English](#) and [French](#).

Important highlights include:

- All students in Grade 10 must complete a self-assessment of the core competencies.
- English 10 now offers students more choice within 2-credit courses in English Language Arts and English First Peoples. [Check out the B.C. website](#) to learn more about the different courses available.
- Career Education now stands alone and is no longer partnered with the Health curriculum.
- Planning 10 is no longer available. This year, Career Life Education and Graduation Transitions are the two 4-credit courses available to meet the 8 credit requirement in Career Education. [Learn more.](#)
- The Health Curriculum is now combined with the Physical Education Curriculum.

Graduation numeracy assessment: was made available in June 2018. The previously scheduled August sitting is rescheduled for Nov. 5-7, with the French assessment available on the first day only. The numeracy assessments will now occur in January, June and November each year. See the [Parent/Student Graduation Numeracy Information Brochure](#) for more information.

Graduation literacy assessment: will be available in Jan. 2020. Until then, the current BC Provincial Examination

remains in place. Please see the attached Graduation Literacy Assessment Specifications for the English program. Specifications for the Francophone and French Immersion programs will be available soon. The sample assessments will be available in late fall, following field testing. An information session on the Graduation Literacy Assessment is scheduled for Feb. 19, 2019.

K-12 Assessment Guidelines

Since the last school year, administrators have continued to work with their school communities to determine if their school will follow Option A/1 or Option B/2 in the interim guidelines.
